A Solar Eclipse and Easter

On April 8, 1974, Hank Aaron of the Atlanta Braves hit his 715th career home run, breaking Babe Ruth's legendary record of 714 homers. He hit a pitch off the Los Angeles Dodgers' Al Downing. However, as Aaron was an African American who had received death threats and racist hate mail during his pursuit of one of baseball's most distinguished records, the achievement was bittersweet.

On the 50th anniversary of this historic event in baseball, a total solar eclipse enters the United States at 1:27pm C.D.T. at Maverick County, Texas, beginning a 15-state tour taking 68 minutes. During this timeframe, the shadow will sweep rapidly northeast across Texas and Oklahoma, portions of the Deep South and Central Great Plains, the Greater Ohio Valley, northwest Pennsylvania, Upstate New York and northern New England.

Do you think the eclipse has anything to do with the Hank Aaron anniversary? Maybe it is a celestial testimony to one of baseball's greatest players, or on the other hand an astronomical indictment of prejudice in the United States? I would imagine not, but let's not simply ignore the idea.

If I could predict such an occurrence a millennium ago (But don't hold me to the date because I'm not sure when people started to be able to predict eclipses), I could have used that information to convince people that supernatural powers supported whatever scheme I would have devised. "I will darken the sun on April 8th if ...," and then fill in whatever follows.

Imagine even today if the total solar eclipse had arrived just eight days earlier on Easter Sunday. There could have been all sorts of religious pronouncements based on this coincidence. God would be saying something to us, good or bad, based on the paths of the moon and the earth. I can easily imagine the fire and brimstone preachers issuing warnings of Endtime importance that the saints will be resurrected to glory and the sinners to damnation (cf. Matthew 24:29).

Maybe something similar has happened at some point in human history, I have no idea. However, it is true that the heavens have always been coopted to speak for Heaven. I'm not speaking about an awe of the night sky like that of the Psalmist: "The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge. There is no speech, nor are there words; their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world." (19:1-4)

I'm speaking about what is called "the God of the gaps:" if science cannot explain it, God did it. For example, Pierre-Simon, marquis de Laplace (1749 – 1827) was one of the great French mathematical physicists. In physics, he was the first to show that planetary orbits are stable and he developed a model to account for how the solar system formed. Laplace presented his definitive work on the properties of the solar system to Napoleon. Napoleon asked Laplace if it was true that there was no mention of the solar system's Creator in his work. Laplace replied, "I had no need of that hypothesis."

The weakness of "the God of the gaps" argument is that as science is increasingly able to explain the strangest events of the universe, God must grow ever smaller. When I was in college, the power of quasars could not be explained, but now they are defined. I would count on the God-given gift of intelligence to continue to discover, and I see this discovery as evidence that we are made in the image and likeness of God, which is the opposite of "the God of the gaps."

About 95% of the universe is the unknown Dark Energy and Dark Matter. The remaining 5% is what we study and what causes us to look in awe at the night sky. 5%! This awes me. It reveals to me that God is so much more than the small boxes we try to place God in. As we have just entered the Easter Season. Let us not shy away from the resurrection's promise. It is not merely a miracle that breaks the normalcy of creation. It is a mystery that transcends it. Easter is like the eclipse. Not in its strangeness and rarity that are now well understood, but in the awe and wonder we feel in its experience. The tomb was empty. Jesus wasn't there; He's here. This should still make us gasp in amazement, and I hope it does. A blessed, joyous and meaningful Easter Season to you.

EYE SAFETY FOR PARTIAL SOLAR ECLIPSES

Partial or annular solar eclipses are different from total solar eclipses – there is no period of totality when the Moon completely blocks the Sun's bright face. Therefore, <u>during partial or annular solar eclipses, it is never safe</u> to look directly at the eclipse without proper eye protection. When watching a partial or annular solar eclipse directly with your eyes, you must look through safe solar viewing glasses ("eclipse glasses") or a safe handheld solar viewer at all times. Eclipse glasses are NOT regular sunglasses; regular sunglasses, no matter how dark, are not safe for viewing the Sun. Safe solar viewers are thousands of times darker and ought to comply with the ISO 12312-2 international standard. Always inspect your eclipse glasses or handheld viewer before use; if torn, scratched, or otherwise damaged, discard the device. Always supervise children using solar viewers. Do NOT look at the Sun through a camera lens, telescope, binoculars, or any other optical device while wearing eclipse glasses or using a handheld solar viewer — the concentrated solar rays will burn through the filter and cause serious eve injury. April 22nd is Earth Day. *Planet vs. Plastics* is the Global Theme for Earth Day 2024. "It unites students, parents, businesses, governments, churches, unions, individuals, and NGOs in an unwavering commitment to call for the
