Advent Matters

I think you may know that I enjoy watching baseball. I sort of understand the game and the strategy. I don't watch football, and one of the reasons is that I don't understand the game. I'm not seeing what a fan sees. I only see big guys hitting each other. And hockey, well, just forget it.

I listen to Classical music all day when I'm home. The internet makes so many stations available to me. It's wonderful. For as much as I enjoy the music, I guarantee that I'm not getting as much out of it as someone like Anthony, our Music Minister. There are things going on that evade me, but are obvious to a trained ear.

I not only read the news, I also choose to follow certain commentators because I value their more well-informed opinion. Again, they are able to notice things I simply would not see.

I list these few examples as an introduction to the Season of Advent. Please do not take the analogy too explicitly, but Advent is like the kid who gets picked-on, Christmas is like the bully, and the world is the even bigger bully.

Christmas finally arrives and the celebration should last for at least the traditional twelve days until the Epiphany, but the world expects something much different. The day after Christmas, the world begins sales to get rid of it all, and good luck hearing a Christmas carol on the radio ever again until the next November. The world bullies Christmas into silent submission.

And Christmas returns the favour by bullying Advent. Christmas gets cut short by the world so it in turn muscles Advent out of the way. Christmas is in full swing even before we light the first candle of the Advent wreath.

Now, you may ask, what is the harm? Does Advent matter? Think about the list at the top of this column. A deeper understanding of something, whether it be sports, music, news or whatever, allows for a more profound interaction, one that is not possible through a casual encounter.

When we take the opportunity that Advent provides to prepare for the coming mystery of Christmas, to slow down the rush and the hype, and to walk more intentionally from prophecy to promise, then the celebration of Jesus' birth strikes more deeply. Then we can move past settling for the conventional messages of Christmas and explore the challenge of what it means to believe God emptied Himself of His divinity (cf. Philippian 2:5-7) to live among us as one of us as Bethlehem's Holy Child.

Advent's four weeks also share with us the gift of expectation. How many of us have watched a young child's excited expectation as Christmas draws nearer and longed for a taste of that kind of wonder again?

Well, Advent is a season founded on excited expectation. Advent looks in two directions. It looks to the past and remembers the world's longing for the coming of the Saviour. Please take the time to read Isaiah 11:6-9 and feel the wonder of God's prophet.

Then realize that Jesus comes into the world as

the fulfillment of that divine revelation, and yet still the world is filled with violence and destruction. Some Christians look forward to a Second Coming of Jesus to erase this discrepancy, but I wonder



if we are not already inspired and empowered by Jesus' first coming to make a difference. Jesus has proven to us who we can be. Do we believe enough in Him to believe this about ourselves? I know the world is violent and uncaring, but Advent's message of expectation is that hope, peace, joy and love have a fighting chance if we trust who Christmas reveals we can be.

Maybe the child born as Immanuel, "God with us," can offer us an alternative to the self-destructive, self-fulfilling prophecy that we are incorrigible. Advent is the season that looks to the past and prepares for the coming birth of the Saviour, and also looks to the future realizing that divine promises remain to be fulfilled if we take seriously that God is with us as one of us to reveal what is possible by us when we believe.
