# So Many Opportunities

As I write this newsletter article, I think back to this morning and shoveling the driveway after yesterday's new snowfall. I think back to earlier this afternoon and my walk with the dog over snow laden paths through the woods. I love winter snow. If it's going to be winter, let there be snow.



But winter ends this month and spring arrives on the 20<sup>th</sup> at 5:37am. Spring is a special time of renewal and growth. And March offers us many chances of the same when it comes to our church and our faith.

I won't spend much time on this since it is discussed and outlined below, but several local congregations have joined together to present our 24<sup>th</sup> annual **Lenten Discussion Series**. These often delve into unexpected Lenten associations. It is worthwhile to up-end the staid expectations of our Lenten journey. Why not walk with others on these Wednesday evenings and see what we may have left unexplored?

The Southern New England Conference of the United Church of Christ offers semi-annual *Super Saturday* gatherings. They, like most everything else, have moved from in-person to online, but they remain broadly inspiring. The scope of offerings amazes me, and the quality of their keynote speakers is impressive.

Due to the fact that online gatherings can become tedious only because of the method not the content, this usual one-day event is spread out over two consecutive Saturdays. I have already registered for the sessions that interest me. When the Conference pools its resources, gatherings such as *Super Saturday* can be offered. When the United Church of Christ pools all of its resources, we can accomplish wondrous things through our shared generosity as we support the annual Lenten appeal of the *One Great Hour of Sharing*.

One Great Hour of Sharing is part of Our Church's Wider Mission. It is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that carries God's message of love and hope to people in crisis. The UCC works with international partners to provide sources of clean water, food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, and emergency relief and rehabilitation. One Great Hour of Sharing also supports domestic and international ministries for disaster preparedness and response.

If you would like to help the church practice what we preach and help show the authenticity of our proclamation, then I invite you to consider a donation to this worthy effort. Please mark your offeings with "OGHS" so that it is directed to the right place – and thank you.

March also brings Lent to its final, climactic week, a week we call holy. On **Palm Sunday**, palms will be distributed prior and during our worship. They remind us of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, but they also foreshadow that these very same people will be the ones screaming, "Crucify, crucify Him." Faith is not about the optics. It's about the conviction of belief in Jesus and what He stands for, not what we wish He would stand for.

This is my chance to plug **Bible Study**. We meet on alternate weeks for one hour online. The Bible is the recorded history of our faith. It's not the entirety of our faith nor is it inerrant, but it is the record of the spiritual efforts of generations of believers, and we hold its message to be inspired by the Holy Spirit. This is not a book to be left on a shelf if we truly wish to know Jesus better and what He expects of us, His followers.

During March alone, there are many ways in which to reclaim, live and enliven our faith, but it is up to each of us to choose to do so. In the spirit of approaching Spring, in the spirit of Lent's renewal of faith, I ask that you consider sharing in these gifts of the church. Sunday worship will always be at the center of our church-lives, but there is so much more in orbit around it. Maybe try and explore these other opportunities to be church.
