Pentecost Deserves More Attention

Pentecost is derived from the Greek word for fifty. That right there is not at all exciting. Pentecost is named after the fact that it falls 50 days after Easter. This puts Pentecost at a disadvantage when compared with Christmas or Easter and it shouldn't because Pentecost is essential to the continuing life of the church.

At the end of 1 Corinthians, Paul lays out his travel plans. He tells the believers in Corinth that he would like to spend a significant amount of time with them. Then he goes on to explain that he will "stay in Ephesus until Pentecost." (16:8) Pentecost is an important marker for Paul. It is a date around which plans are made.

The significance of the day of Pentecost comes across more emphatically in Acts of the Apostles. Paul is finishing his third missionary journey and "he was eager to be in Jerusalem, if possible, on the day of Pentecost." (20:16) Again, Paul is planning his travel based on the date of Pentecost. These passing comments may seem insignificant, but they speak to the importance of Pentecost among the earliest believers. Why?

Well, that is made abundantly clear in Acts 2. Just as Jewish pilgrims had gathered in Jerusalem, Jesus among them, for the Feast of Passover, so they were converging on the Holy City once again for the Feast of Pentecost or in Hebrew *Shavuot*. *Shavuot* is associated with the wheat harvest in the land of Israel. The period that began with the spring festival of Passover culminated in *Shavuot* fifty days later.

Shavuot was originally an agricultural festival. Eventually, however, it took on an historical meaning. In the Talmud, Israel's ancient Rabbis associated the time it took the people of Israel to travel from Egypt to Mount Sinai with the fifty days of the eponymously named Pentecost. Thus, Shavuot became the anniversary of the day on which Yahweh presented the Law to Moses on tablets of stone. It was for this Jewish festival of Shavuot that "there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem." (Acts 2:5)

It was on this same day that the confused and timid followers of Jesus, few in number since "they were all together in one place," (2:1) all received the Holy Spirit. Inspired by the powerful presence of the Spirit of God, they rushed out onto the streets of Jerusalem and there they preached for the first time of Jesus. In this passage, Jesus is twice referred to as a man. (2:22, 23) This unadorned language hints at a very early date of composition. Also, Jesus does not resurrect, which entails His active power. Rather, "God raised him up," which is passive and another indication of a very early composition. Then Peter, who recently had betrayed and deserted Jesus, declares publicly and loudly before all sorts of devout Jews, "All of us are witnesses." (2:32) In other words, the followers of Jesus, now inspired by the descent of Pentecost's Holy Spirit, are readied to continue the ministry and message of Jesus.

With this, the church is born. God the Father raises God the Son from death and also sends God the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' first followers so that they act not on their own, but as inspired by God. This bedrock of the Spirit's presence and power replaces the religious foundation of the Mosaic Law for Christians. Pentecost's Spirit becomes Christianity's Mount Sinai.

Paul writes to the church in Corinth: "Our competence is from God who has made us competent to be ministers of a new covenant, not of letter but of Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life." (2 Corinthians 3:5-6) This fundamental reordering of the meaning of Pentecost is why Paul struggled mightily to return to Jerusalem to be in the place where the Spirit was first shared so powerfully that it transformed people who believed (they had seen the Ascension!) into people who would be witnesses, and the church was born. May Pentecost be formative in the same way with us today, with us who are the same church today as the church that was born that first Pentecost Sunday. May the Pentecost Spirit continue to excite and empower us.
