The Continuing Pentecost Church

Take a look at this month's church calendar and see that our church life is a positive microcosm of the world we live in.

Let's begin with the obvious. Church is when we gather for worship and community. This year May includes many important Christian celebrations. The Acts of the Apostles informs us that the resurrected Jesus appears to His disciples for 40 days "speaking about the kingdom of God." (Acts 1:3) Then, on that 40th day, Jesus ascends into the heavens to assume His rightful place in glory, and His final words are, "'You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

The disciples have been charged with evangelism, sharing the gospel with all the world, but for ten days they are incapable of doing anything of the sort. They do not know how to begin or are too fearful to begin. That is until Pentecost, the 50th day after Easter. On this occasion, the Holy Spirit descends upon those first believers in Jerusalem. Now inspired and empowered by the Spirit they rush out into the streets of Jerusalem and begin to preach Jesus and His gospel. This is the birthday of the church. This is when the Spirit-filled members of the church carry forward the work of Jesus. This is the work that continues still today through us as church. We remain the Pentecost church.

On that first Pentecost Sunday, Acts shares with us some of the earliest of the Christian proclamation. Scholars tell us that this is an example of primitive Christian theology. Peter preaches that "God raised [Jesus] up" from the grave on Easter and that "God has made [Jesus] both Lord and Messiah." This is combined with the abiding presence of God's Spirit who is inspiring Peter's Pentecost words.

Here we have reference to God, Jesus and Spirit, but at this primitive stage they have not yet been recognized as Trinity, as one God in three divine persons. This will actually take the church three centuries more to define. The Trinity is an example of God's continuing revelation, of God's still-speaking Word. The church acknowledges and celebrates this divine self-revelation on the Sunday after Pentecost, which is Trinity Sunday.

As on the first Pentecost, the church ventured out into the world around its sanctuary. As part of my role as pastor, I belong to the Hatfield Equity Alliance and to HEADS Up, a group advocating for mental health awareness in town. Both these organizations are helping engage our community with the national Children's Mental Health Awareness Week. This year's theme is: "Lighting the Path to Social Justice for Children and Youth." Prizes will be awarded for artwork created by students at Smith Academy and Hatfield Elementary, along with submissions from the Senior Center and Service Net. A flier is on page 4.

The congregation also shares in the joy of Mother's Day as we offer prayers for the mothers among us and those called to their heavenly reward. We participate, as well, in our local Memorial Day observance as we remember and pray for all those men and women who offered the supreme sacrifice of their lives defending our nation. These are but three examples, just in the month of May, of how our church lives into the community of which we have been a part since its founding.

I ask that you also look at how we are involved with the larger church as part of our religious covenant with the Association, Conference and UCC. Both the Association and Conference will gather for Annual Meetings next month. These gatherings are testimony that we are part of the larger church. The fullness of church resides in each congregation, but in covenant we cooperate with one another to expand our outreach, not unlike Jesus' final command to begin in Jerusalem but to eventually reach all the world. Please think about becoming involved in the wider church.

Our congregation helps fulfill a profound need for a deepening, spiritual relationship with God and each other. Worship gives us the blessing of stillness in a busy, noisy world so that we can hear and feel the nearness of God. This then leaves us enlivened by the Pentecost Spirit to bring compassion and justice into a terribly troubled world. And all of this just in the month of May. Church is a blessing that I hope we celebrate and better appreciate during this month of its founding.

PENTECOST SUNDAY

According to the Acts of the Apostles, on the 40th day after Easter, Jesus ascended into the heavens. Ascension Day falls on May 9th this year. As Jesus returned to His rightful place in heaven's glory, His parting words to the assembled followers were: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)


Ten days later, Jesus' followers were gathered together. Luke shares this testimony: "Suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among

them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." (Acts 2:2-4)

As the now Spirit-led followers of Jesus rush out onto the streets of Jerusalem, as they begin to proclaim Jesus and His gospel, the church is born. On Pentecost, God empowers the followers of Jesus from that moment forward to continue the ministry begun by Christ. This is an important holy day in the life of the church. We remember when the church was born and we reaffirm that the Spirit guides and strengths us still. This is a day for us to be together as the church at worship.
