## Christian Education Should Never End

I have not had a September that brought me back to the classroom since 1992. I would have to say I miss it a tad bit. Even after these 30 years, though, I still associate September with the start of a new school year; and even after these 30 years I still associate the new academic year with the opportunity of learning, even of lifetime learning.

I would like to begin by thanking all who are involved with **Christian Education** in our congregation, especially Anita W. who has led this effort for I don't know how many years. This is where formal Christian learning begins for many of our youngest folk.

For me one of the most difficult portions of leading the worship Service is the children's sermon. It takes a good deal of effort to try and convey a religious lesson to young people. Our Christian Ed volunteers do this every Sunday all year round, and for a lot longer than the five minutes I spend with them on the steps of the Chancel. They are planting the intellectual seeds that I hope and pray will grow and develop for a lifetime. Christian Education is truly a ministry within the church and we want to make sure our volunteers know we appreciate them.

Another phase of Christian education is Confirmation. **Confirmation** is quite simply when a person chooses to *confirm* what was said for them or by them at Baptism. It is usually conferred on young adults at the age when they have reached a level of maturity where they are capable of making their own choice, but it can also be shared with any adult who was not Confirmed previously. In this sense, Confirmation is like the completion of Baptism.

To prepare for Confirmation means in part to be intellectually readied to promise solemnly "to be a faithful member of the church of Jesus Christ ..." (From the UCC rite of Confirmation) To make this promise in a meaningful way means to have lived the life of the church and to know the teachings of the church well enough to offer assent, which means Confirmation

preparation needs an active church life and further Christian education.

I would like to begin Confirmation classes for anyone 14 or older this September. If you may be interested, please let me know.

Christian education does not reach its summit, I would hope, as a young adult. If we're to follow the perfect example of Jesus and seek the perfect wisdom of God, then I would expect this to be a constant journey. In the UCC, every Christian is called to service, to ministry. Every Sunday we print in the bulletin, "Ministers: All who worship here." To serve God, to do the work of church, requires a certain depth of religious knowledge and curiosity. So adult Christian education is ongoing.

Our **Bible study group** is nearing the completion of a survey of the books of the Christian Bible. I am not sure if we follow this immediately by reading a particular biblical book in more depth **or if we try something new.**

I have read recently Diarmaid MacCulloch's *Christianity: The First Three Thousand Years*. What an exceptional history of the church. I wonder if there would be an interest in exploring this topic. Or what about a book club sort of study? I am intrigued by Mohsin Hamid's new book *The Last White Man*, which confronts us with the themes of judgment and worth. Would that interest anyone? Do you have ideas, books, you would like to explore?

A sermon is a teaching tool, but it shares my thoughts. Adult Christian education allows us to share each other's thoughts. Interested?

Also, I post on our FaceBook page the links to offerings of the UCC or the Conference. There are many a worthwhile presentation that are only a Zoom link away. There are very talented and knowledgeable people in our church denomination, and they are available to share their expertise. **Check out our FaceBook page or website** to see what may be out there at any given time.

It's September, a time to think about learning. We should never want to outgrow this blessing.
